Mountain View Elementary is a K-5 Title I school located in northeast Anchorage. We educate approximately 400 students with a staff of 17 classroom teachers, 14 certificated specialists and numerous support personnel. Our student population is comprised of multiple racial and ethnic groups who speak more than 20 languages.

We celebrate diversity in our school and in our neighborhood. We are a former Reading First school and continue to

maintain a strong emphasis on scientifically based reading programs and school-wide progress monitoring. Our instruction is data-driven and very effective. In recent years, our school has met the performance standards for Adequate Yearly Progress under the No Child Left Behind Act several times. Math has been an especially strong point for our students and we have fielded several winning Math Derby teams.

## **District Adequate Yearly Progress**

According to the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, ASD is in its seventh year of Level 4 corrective status. In 2011-12, the All Students, African-American, Alaska Native, Two or More Races, Low Income, Disabled and Limited English Proficient student groups did not meet AYP in both language arts and math performance. The Asian and Hispanic student groups did not meet AYP in math performance only. Additionally, the district did not meet the 85 percent graduation rate threshold. Parents are strongly encouraged to participate in the development of school and district improvement plans that address the achievement of all students.
